**\* A dedicated Maths Lab promoting hands-on learning**



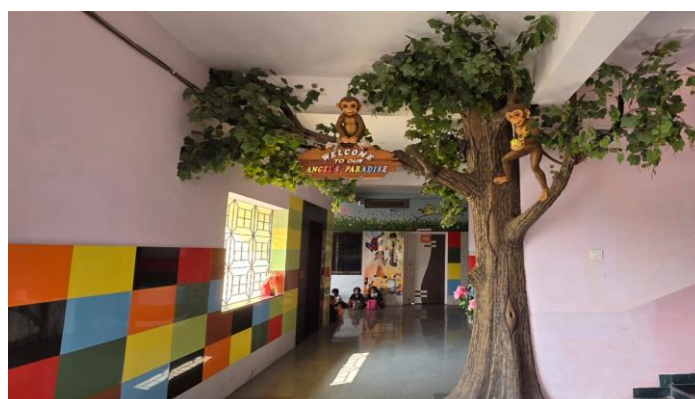
